### Artesa Elements 2004

Soft and elegant with a subtle punch that reminds you what you're drinking is not an ordinary wine. A blend of Rhône, Bordeaux and Rioja varietals, this wine packs together variety and flavor. **91**



### Montes Purple Angel 2005

A full-bodied earthy blend of Carmenère and Petit Verdot from Chile's Colchagua. Intense flavors, firm tannins and a lasting finish. A unique blend, and one of the best from Chile we've tasted in a long time. Really good. **90**



### Overstone Pinot Noir 2007

An inviting nose of well-developed cherry aromas. Medium-bodied and full of flavor. Distinctly Pinot Noir and distinctly New Zealand. **89**
